**RAPS** assemblies. We have been continuing our learning in our PSHE lessons through our collective worship this week. Our topic for PSHE is 'Living in the wider world' and at the moment we are learning about 'Belonging to a Community'. All children in school have further developed their knowledge and understanding of this topic through key questions such as:

- Y1: What should the rules be for playing outside?
- Y2: What does it mean to be responsible? What responsibilities do we have at home?
- Y3: Which communities do we belong to?
- Y4: What are the rules and our rights in school? Is it important that we have them?
- Y5: How can we protect and support our local environment in and around school?

Y6: Should we challenge stereotypes?

It has also been our **RAPS value week** during which we have been thinking about and discussing how to be a good citizen. Can the children talk about these important themes to you at home?





Thank you for your co-operation and support last term in sending your children into school in **PE kits on their PE day**. This has been very successful and the children receive more teaching time in PE. However, could we remind you that PE kits should only include a plain white t-shirt, black or grey or navy tracksuit bottoms, black or navy or grey or red sports hoody (plain or small logo only) and trainers. Children can also wear their school jumper or cardigan over their PE t-shirt. No football shirts, characters or patterns please. Thank you for your support.

Notice from the NHS. Back to school advice issued amid high levels of flu, COVID-19 and scarlet fever. It's important to minimise the spread of infection in schools and other education and child-care settings as much as possible. If your child has a fever, they should stay home from school or nursery until the fever has resolved.

Helping children to learn about the importance of good hand hygiene is also key, so practice regular handwashing at home with soap and warm water.

Catching coughs and sneezes in tissues then binning them is another simple way to help stop illness from spreading.


Remember that flu vaccination is still available for all eligible groups and is the best protection against the virus. We have seen good uptake in older age groups but vaccination among young children remains low. Flu can be very unpleasant and in some cases can lead to more serious illness. Getting your child vaccinated protects them and others they come into contact with, and it's still not too late.

Eligible children include:

- · those aged 2 and 3 on 31 August 2022
- · all primary school-aged children
- · some secondary school-aged children

Your child might be eligible if you access: income support, income based jobseekers allowance or ESA, child tax credit (provided you are not also entitled to working tax credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16190), universal credit, provided you have an annual net income not exceeding £7,400 or support under part VI of the immigration and Asylum Act 1999. 
