In our assemblies. This week has been both World Environment Day and World Oceans Day so at Richard Avenue we have been thinking about looking after our World and how people care for the environment in different ways. This also links to our RE curriculum which asks us to learn more about how people of different faiths show care for the world. We welcomed wonderful visitors from Groundworks who explained how we can work to-

gether reduce to our waste and raise awareness of the need to reuse and recycle. Such important messages for now and for the future.





PE coaches visit Richard Avenue. Jamie from Sunderland AFC Foundation of Light came into school to deliver PE to our reception children. He led a story



based session based on The Gruffalo. The children took part in different physical activities whilst pretending to be different animals from the story. Reception will be having these story based PE ses-

sions throughout this half term and next academic year. Reception parents can expect lots of updates on Seesaw

where we will share what the children get up to. Will from Everyone Active came into school to deliver three sessions to the Year 3 children. They learned different tennis skills but also focused on working together as a team. Will and Mr Spoors then selected children to represent the school in a future tennis tournament. " The children were great listeners and they showed great effort especially helping each other in their teams" said Will.



Parent online safety update. One of the key challenges of modern day gaming is the increasing interaction that children have with others through private messaging features. Thank you to some of the parents in our school who have highlighted common games that our children are engaging with and the potential risks. Earlier this week, the BBC released an article highlighting the significant risks within the popular game of Roblox and the inappropriate content that it may present, when not carefully managed by parents. Top attendance. Congratulations to 4G who have top attendance this week achieving 99.3%.



So far Joseph's efforts have raised £560 for BowelBabe.


